Northern Lights Palace Pool Fall Leadership Courses

Bronze Star (CPR-A) - Nov. 15 & 16 - \$ 65

In Bronze Star, participants develop problem-solving and decision-making skills as individuals and as partners. They learn cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), develop confidence and the lifesaving skills needed to be a lifesaver.

Bronze Cross - Nov. 21, 22, 23 - \$ 85

Designed for lifesavers who want the challenge of more advanced training, including an introduction to safe supervision in aquatic environments. Students learn the differences between lifeguarding and lifesaving while continuing to develop the basic principles of emergency procedures and teamwork. Lifesavers further increase their stroke efficiency, fitness and endurance

Bronze Cross is a prerequisite for all advanced training programs, including Lifesaving Instructor, National Lifeguard Service and Distinction certification.

LSS Standard First Aid - Dec. 5, 6, 7

Teaches the care of injuries and illnesses, including how to treat pulseless victims and basic life support skills. Emphasis is placed on vital signs, priority assessment and basic emergency care principles. Automated External Defibrillator (AED) Training included. This course includes First Aid & CPR Guidelines 2005 and meets OH&S regulations for Basic First Aid.

Bronze Medallion - Feb. 12, 13, 14 - \$ 85 plus books

The Bronze Medallion award teaches an understanding of the lifesaving principles embodied in the four components of water rescue education: judgment, knowledge, skill and fitness.

Rescuers learn tows and carries and defence and release methods in preparation for challenging rescues of increased risk, involving conscious and unconscious victims of various types. Participants also develop stroke efficiency and endurance in timed swims, as well as treatment skills for many circulatory emergencies.

NOTICE: City of Melfort — ZONING BYLAW AMENDMENT

Public Notice is hereby given that at their December 8th, 2008, regular meeting, the City of Melfort Council, pursuant to Section 207 of The Planning & Development Act, 2007, will consider a Bylaw to amend the Melfort Zoning Bylaw No. 96-09, as hereinafter provided:

Intent:

It is proposed to amend Zoning Bylaw No. 96-09, in the manner hereinafter set forth:

1. That the Zoning District Map forming part of Bylaw 96-09 be amended by rezoning from UH – Urban Holdings to R1A – AC1 – Low Density Residential Architectural Control District, Lots 1-11 inclusive, Block 1 of Parcel AC, Plan 101891000, as shown on the attached Schedule "A".

2. That Subsection 10.3 – R1A – Low Density Residential District be amended to include the following new clause:

"10.3.8 Architectural Control District
R1A – AC1 – use and development of land or buildings in this district must be in accordance with the local area design plan, attached as Schedule "B" to Bylaw 2008-28."

3. This Bylaw shall come into force and take effect on the date of its final passing thereof. The proposed Bylaw and attached Schedules may be inspected by any interested person at the City Office of the City of Melfort, 202 Burrows Avenue West, Melfort, Saskatchewan, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

The Council of the City of Melfort will hear all submissions regarding the proposed amendments and all persons who are present and wish to speak at 5:00 p.m. on Monday, December 8th, 2008. All written submissions received by 12:00 p.m. on Thursday, December 4th, 2008, will be forwarded to Council.
