Bronze Medallion – March 24-26 – \$90 plus books. The Bronze Medallion award teaches an understanding of the lifesaving principles embodied in the four components of water rescue education: judgment, knowledge, skill, and fitness.

Rescuers learn tows and carries, and defence and release methods in preparation for challenging rescues of increased risk, involving conscious and unconscious victims of various types. Participants also develop stroke efficiency and endurance in timed swims. As well as treatment skills for many circulatory emergencies.

Bronze Cross – April 16-18 or April 30-May 2 – \$90. Designed for lifesavers who want the challenge of more advanced training, including an introduction to safe supervision in aquatic environments. Students learn the differences between lifeguarding and lifesaving while continuing to develop the basic principles of emergency procedures and teamwork. Lifesavers further increase their stroke efficiency, fitness and endurance.

Bronze Cross is a prerequisite for all advanced training programs, including Lifesaving Instructor, National Lifeguard Service, and Distinction certification.

LSS Standard First Aid (Dryland)/AEC – April 16-18 or April 30-May 2 - \$150
Teaches the care of injuries and illnesses, including how to treat pulseless victims and basic life support skills. Emphasis is placed on vital signs, priority assessment and basic emergency care principles. Treatment of bleeding, burns, fractures, heat & cold emergencies, seizures, diabetes, poisoning, head & spinal injuries, etc. Automated External Defibrillator (AED) training is included. This course includes the First Aid & CPR Guidelines 2005 and meets OH&S regulations for Basic First Aid.

An optional 4 extra hours will give you an Aquatic Emergency Care Certification. Provides training for any individuals who may need to respond to a first aid emergency in an aquatic setting. Just enough to get your feet wet!

Qualifications

- Must be at least 15 years old to begin working.

- Must be willing to attain prerequisite training courses.

- Partial reimbursement for bathing suits.
- \$390.00 reimbursed based for 44 hour courses once certified and required hours are worked.
